Businesses, regardless of size, should be aware that paid family leave (PFL) benefits provided by employers have increased as of January 1, 2019, Zoupaniotis said.

“Employees in New York who work 26 or more consecutive weeks will be eligible to receive up to 10 weeks of PFL at 55 percent of their average weekly wage, but not exceeding 55 percent of New York State’s average weekly wage,” she said.

“Eligible employees may receive PFL (1) to provide care for a family member’s serious health condition; (2) to bond with their child the first 12 months after the child’s birth or adoption; or (3) to attend to obligations because the employee’s spouse, child or parent is called into active military service.”
