# Who's Who | in Commercial & Residential Real Estate Law

## JASON S. SAMUELS

Jason S. Samuels is a partner in Farrell Fritz PC's commercial litigation department, concentrating in construction law. "As a construction lawyer representing contractors and developers, I see a different perspective of the real estate market than many other commercial real estate attorneys," Samuels noted. "Recently and perhaps to the surprise of the commercial real estate community at large, new construction and renovation projects have increased dramatically over the past nine months, particularly in Manhattan, Brooklyn and Queens. The general consensus is that Long Island will soon follow."

"Now that construction appears to be revived, more owners are seeking competitive advantages for new construction and major renovation projects," he said. "This often involves owners seeking certification of their projects as 'sustainable' or 'green' buildings."

Aside from achieving tax credits, owners can also attain a competitive advantage over other owners because sustainable buildings are more marketable, Samuels said.

"One of the most popular certification programs is the LEED program which stands for Leadership in Energy and Envi-



ronmental Design," he said. "The increased focus on sustainable buildings raises interesting new legal questions involving, for example, insurance liability issues, questions of responsibility for means and methods of construction, responsibility for the failure to achieve anticipated LEED certification levels as well as potential tenant/use issues because of reliance on those LEED certification levels."

Prior to joining Farrell Fritz in 2011, for nearly five years Samuels was principal of Jason Samuels, PC, a law firm practicing construction, surety and real estate law. Prior to starting his own firm, Samuels was vice president and general counsel of a successful mid-size general contracting and construction management corporation. He represented his construction company in all legal matters as well as in New York City Department of Building and Environmental Control Board hearings. In addition, he managed and completed multiple construction projects from estimating to project completion. Projects included construction of new residential multi-family housing, renovation of high end commercial space as well as institutional projects. His company's clients were diverse and included hospitals, banks, unions and universities.

Samuels served as a director and secretary of World Cares Center, Inc., a notfor-profit corporation formed after September 11, 2001 to benefit emergency responders in downtown Manhattan.
